Tremblant to host Raid the North 36-Hour Adventure Race

TORONTO, ON. – March 11, 2002. Frontier Adventure Racing Inc., Canada's premiere adventure racing company, is pleased to announce that Tremblant will host the Raid the North adventure race once again this year. Scheduled for June 1-2, this 36-hour, non-stop race will take teams of four through a 150 km course of trekking, mountain biking, canoeing and ropes.

"We are very excited to be working with Tremblant again this year," said David Zietsma, president of Frontier Adventure Racing Inc. "The fabulous resort location, partnered with the beautiful Laurentians terrain, made last year's race one of our most popular events of the season, and we are hoping for an even bigger turnout this year."

Raid the North – Tremblant will be one of five, 36-hour races across Canada that serve as qualifiers for the Raid the North Series Championship race at the end of the season. The top five finishing teams will earn a spot in the Series Championship race, while the winners will receive free entry to that race, plus \$1,000 CDN cash.

"The challenging terrain we have to offer in this area is perfect for this type of competition," said Christian Asselin, public relations and communications coordinator for Tremblant. "Everyone at Tremblant was so happy about last year's experience, especially the level of the athletes that participated in the race, that we decided to host the event for a second year in a row."

For local residents who are interested in coming out and watching the race, there will be maps and directions available at basecamp, located at the base of the mountain. Although the race will mostly take place deep in the wilderness, there will be a few checkpoints along the route that will be accessible by car and we encourage spectators to come and cheer the teams on. The first team is expected to cross the finish line (also located at the base of the mountain) around 2 a.m. on Sunday morning. The official race cut-off time is noon on Sunday.

For anyone who is not quite ready to compete in a 36-hour race, Frontier Adventure Racing Inc. will also be holding the very popular Salomon Adventure Challenge race on Saturday, June 1. This 5-8 hour race is designed to be a fun, yet challenging way to enjoy adventure racing and is a great opportunity for others to participate in this growing sport. Adventure racing is a new sport that has exploded in popularity across North America.
